

# What is a Railway Carman?

Railway Carmen inspect, troubleshoot, maintain, and repair structural and mechanical components of railway freight, passenger and urban transit rail cars.

The proper usage of tools and equipment is an important part of the Carmen training. TCU/IAM trains students going through the Carmen program on these important safety procedures.

Many TCU/IAM students also take training courses on the MSSC (Manufacturing Skills Standard Council) safety and OSHA 10 safety certifications.

Because of the technical abilities that a Carman needs to possess, welding or auto-mechanics are great trades for Job Corps students to have under their belt before coming into the TCU/IAM Advanced Training Program.
